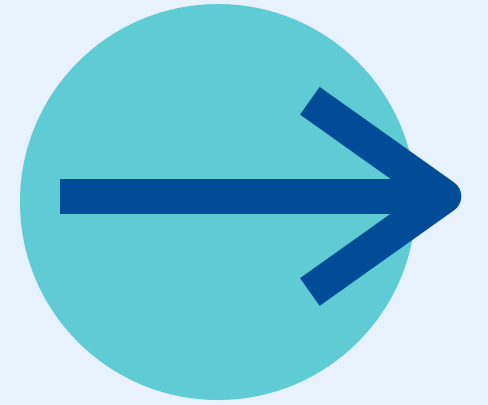

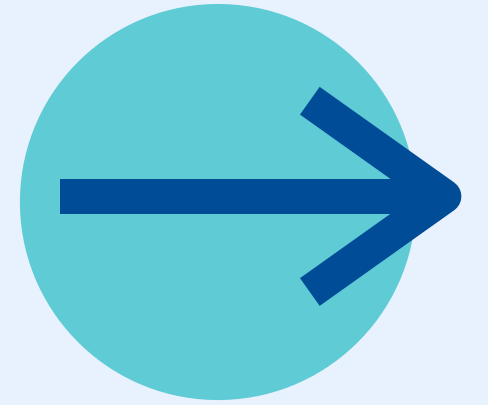

Understanding Mandatory Optional Fees

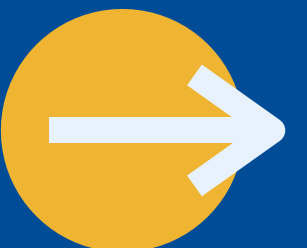
**SONOMA
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Seawolf Bundle Fees

- For 2026/27: \$21 per unit charge
- Learning materials fee that provides access to required textbooks and course content for single, flat fee
- Charged to all students with the option to opt out 30 days before the first day of classes

Student Involvement and Representation Fee (SIRF)

- \$2 fee per semester
- CSU systemwide fee charges to all students to establish a funding model for the California State Student Association (CSSA)
- Students can opt out once enrolled and must opt out no later than the census date for each semester



Registration Payment Due Dates

Important to Know:

- Registration charges must be paid in full before classes begin each semester.
- Payment deadlines vary based on when you enroll in classes.
- Due dates are posted on the Seawolf Services Center website.
- Review your student account regularly to avoid missing a payment deadline.

⚠ Failure to pay by the due date may result in disenrollment.

- You may be dropped from your classes.
- You may lose eligibility to attend for the semester.

- Fall 2026 Student Charges/Fees & Payment Due Dates

- Registration 4/13/26 - 8/12/26, student charges/fees due **August 12, 2026** (non-payment subject to dis-enrollment).
- Registration 8/19/26 - 9/4/26, student charges/fees due by **September 4, 2026**. All students who begin the registration process on or after August 19, 2026 may be subject to a \$25 late registration fee.

Know Your Charges: On-Campus Housing Costs

Housing Charges:

- Full-semester housing charges are posted to student accounts in mid-July.
- Housing costs are billed in four installments (First installment for Fall 2026 due August 1).
- Charges reflect your housing rent minus the \$100 housing down payment already paid to reserve your space.
- Rates are listed online at: housing.sonoma.edu/rates

First-Time First Year Students:

- Housing charges include both your room rent and required Seawolf All Access Meal Plan (Both are included in the installment plan payment).

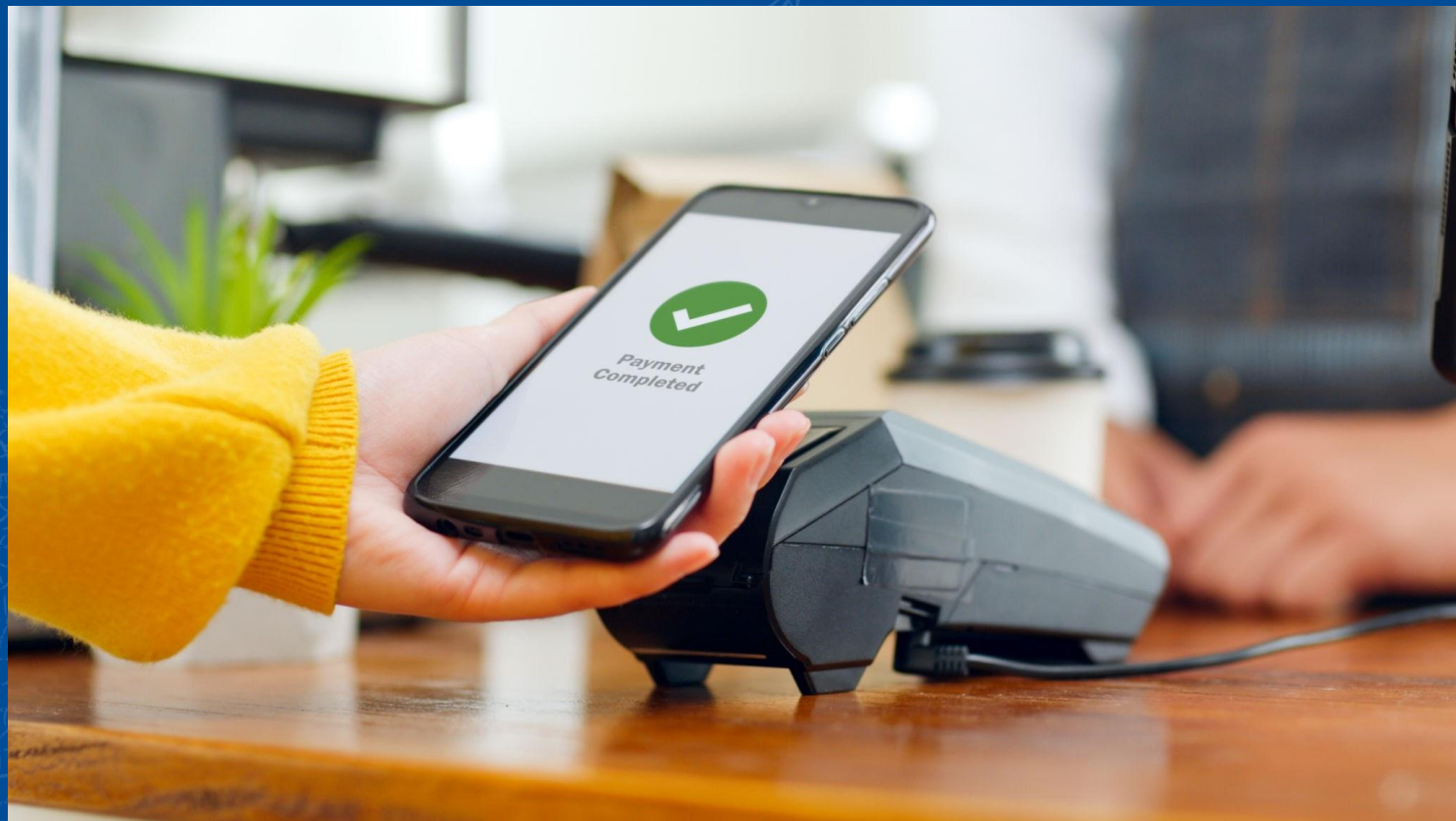

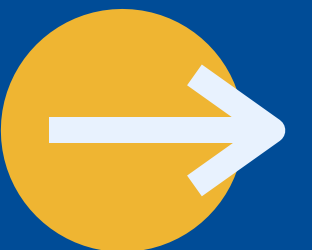

How To Make Payments

- Questions about registration payment plans? Contact the Seawolf Service Center at (707) 664-2308.
- Using financial aid? Ensure your fall 2026 award is verified in MySSU before the payment due date so eligible aid can be applied to your charges.



Your Charges and Payments: E-Bill Statement Notifications

- An e-bill notification will be sent to your SSU email account each month until all semester charges are paid.
- Review the **Activity Details** page in the Payment tile for 24/7 access to:
 - Charges and payments

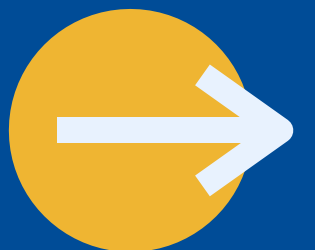
Payer Access

- Students may grant parents, guardians, or other guests Payer Access to view and make payments on their account.
- Even with Payer Access, students are responsible for ensuring all charges are paid by posted deadlines.
- Visit the Seawolf Service Center website for information about Payer Access and the Payer User Guide.

Financial Aid Disbursement

- Initial financial aid disbursements are applied to student accounts during the first week of the semester.
- Aid is applied to registration fees first, then housing charges.
- Any remaining funds are refunded to the student by paper check or direct deposit.

Tip: Direct deposit is the fastest way to receive your refund. Sign up in MySSU.



Refund Deadlines

Withdraws and Fee Refunds

Withdrawing from SSU

- To receive a 100% refund, you must withdraw completely from SSU before the first day of classes.
- **Fall 2026 deadline: August 23, 2026**

After Classes Begin

- Refunds are prorated through the 60% point of the term.
- No refunds are issued after that date.

Changing Enrollment Status

- The last day to change from full-time (7+ units) to part-time (1-6 units) is the semester add/drop deadline.
- **Fall 2026 deadline: September 4, 2026**

FERPA and Authorize to Release

Protecting Your Educational Rights

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) protects the privacy of student education records.

- The Seawolf Service Center and Financial Aid Office can only share student financial information as permitted by FERPA.
- Students control who may access their information.

Authorize Access in MySSU

Students can use the Authorize to Release page in MySSU Student Center>Personal Information to grant designated individuals access to specific SSU records and information.

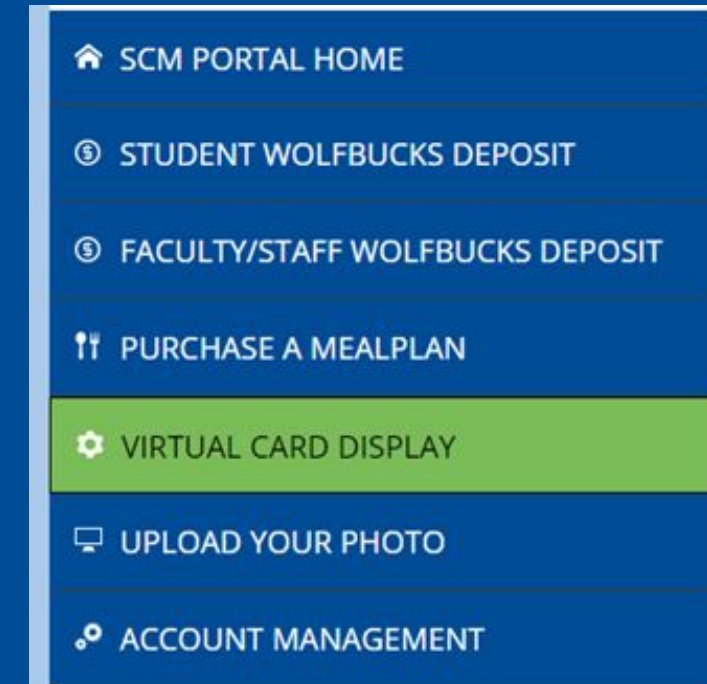
Your SSU Student ID Card

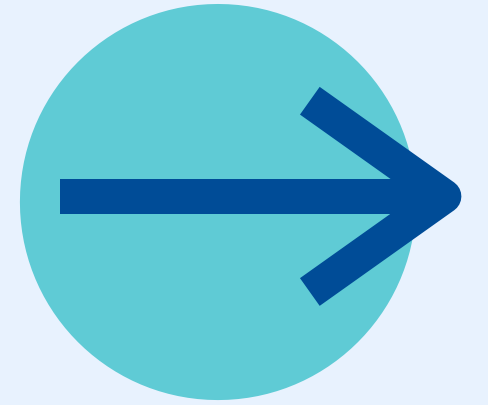

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Applying for Financial Aid

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- Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and California Dream Act Application (CDAA) available October 1.
 - [FAFSA.gov](https://fafsa.gov)
 - [DREAM.csac.ca.gov](https://dream.csac.ca.gov)
- All students should have completed the 2026-27 application to be considered for aid for the upcoming academic year.
- The 2027-28 application opens **October 1, 2026.**



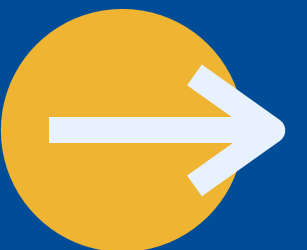


Stay on Track for Financial Aid

- Complete the FAFSA or CADAA by **March 2 each year** to be considered an on-time applicant.
- New Cal Grant applicants must submit a GPA Verification Form by March 2.
- Check your MySSU To Do List regularly and submit all requested documents by their deadlines.
- Continuing students typically receive financial aid offers in late April, after all required documents have been received and reviewed.

Housing Discrepancy

- Your financial aid award is based on the housing preference you selected in Cal State Apply.
- **If your housing plans change, notify the Financial Aid Office as soon as possible.** This discrepancy may delay your financial aid disbursement.
- Example: You have listed on-campus housing on Cal State Apply, but later decide to live off campus or at home.



Academic Transcripts

SONOMA
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- Financial aid cannot be disbursed until all required academic transcripts have been received and reviewed by Admissions.

Important:

- After your Spring 2026 grades are posted, request that your final academic transcript be sent to Sonoma State University.
- Delays in submitting transcripts may delay your financial aid disbursement.



CalKIDS College Savings Program

Who may be eligible?

- Children born in California on or after July 1, 2022
- Eligible low-income California public school children in grades 1-12

Program Benefit

- Participants receive a seed deposit in a CalKids account to help pay for education after high school.
- Eligible students may receive up to \$1,500 in college savings.

Register: calkids.org

\$500

Every eligible low-income public school student in grades 1-12 will have a CalKIDS account created in their name with an initial deposit of \$500.

+ \$500

Eligible students identified as foster youth will receive an additional one-time \$500 deposit.

+ \$500

Eligible students identified as homeless will receive an additional one-time \$500 deposit.

= Up to \$1,500 in free money for college for students!*

Federal Direct Loans

Annual Loan Limits: Federal students loans are subject to yearly borrowing limits established by the U.S. Department of Education.

Beginning in 2026-27, Direct Loan eligibility will be adjusted based on a student's enrollment level.

Loan proration is based on:

Units Enrolled ÷ **Full-Time Units

****24 units per academic year (Fall/Spring) is considered full-time**

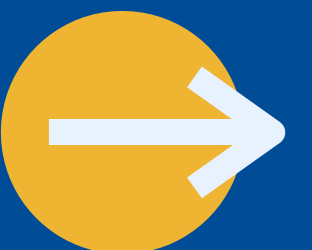

Loan Processing Fee

- 1.057% of the loan amount is deducted before funds are disbursed.

Accept or Decline Your Loans

- Any loans that are declined/canceled may be reinstated by submitting a [Direct Loan Change Form](#).

To Receive a Parent PLUS Loan

- Parent borrower must complete the [Parent PLUS Loan Application](#)
- Credit approval is required
- A new application is required each academic year
- Parent borrower must complete a [Master Promissory Note \(MPN\)](#)

If the Parent PLUS Loan is Denied

The student may be eligible to borrow additional Unsubsidized Loan funds:

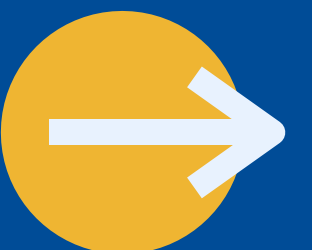
- Freshmen/Sophomore: up to \$4,000
- Junior/Senior: up to \$5,000

Loan Limits:

- Annual Maximum: \$20,000
- Aggregate limit per dependent student: \$65,000



Reminder: Borrow only what you need to help minimize future debt.

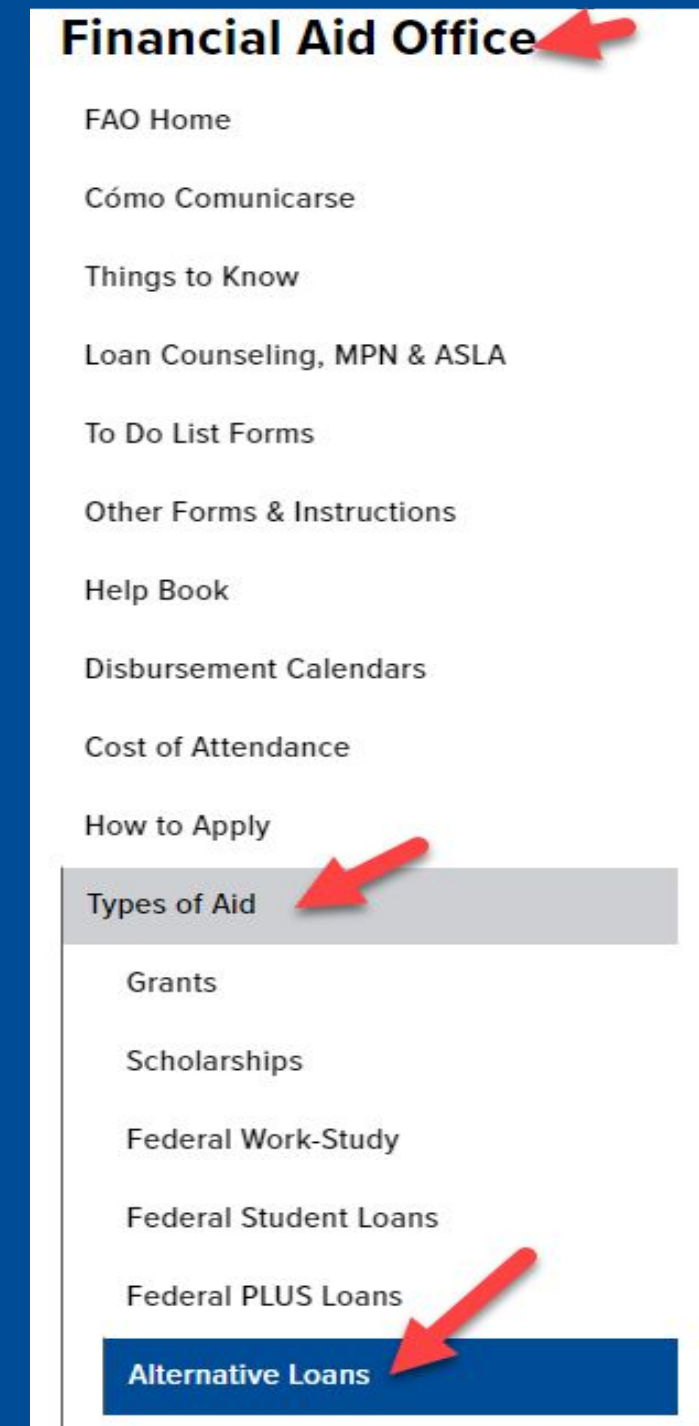

Alternate (Private) Education Loans

- Private education loans are offered by banks, credit unions, and other lenders.
- Approval is based on the borrower's credit history and creditworthiness.
- Interest rates may be variable or fixed.
- Rates may be higher or lower than Federal Direct Loan rates, depending on the lender and borrower qualifications.

Compare Lenders with ELMSelect

- ELMSelect helps students and families compare education loan lenders and loan products in one place.



Financial Aid Disbursements

Know When to Expect Your Aid

- Review the financialaid.sonoma.edu/disbursement-calendarsendars for each term on the Financial Aid website.
 - Disbursements generally occur every Monday throughout the semester.
 - Annual financial aid is typically disbursed half in Fall and half in Spring.
- Financial aid is first applied to outstanding fees/institutional charges first. Any remaining funds are refunded to student.
- Sign up for Direct Deposit through your SSU Portal to have refunds sent directly to your bank account.
- Students should be prepared to purchase their books and supplies before receiving a financial aid refund.
- If you are participating in the Seawolf Bundle, your required course materials are already covered.



Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)

To remain eligible for financial aid, students must meet all three SAP standards:

Pace (Pass Rate) Standard:

- Successfully complete a minimum of 67% of all attempted units (undergraduate students).

Maximum Time Frame Standard:

- Complete your degree within 150% of the units required for your program.

GPA Standard:

- Maintain a minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA (undergraduate students).

Family Contribution Appeal

Special Circumstances/Family Contribution (EFC) Appeal

Examples of Qualifying Circumstances

- Change in income or employment
- Change in parent marital status
- Loss of taxed or untaxed benefits
- One-time income received in a prior year that will not continue in future years

- Complete the appropriate Special Circumstances form through MyFA Forms.
